Chinook Salmon Derby

History

From the early 1960's Jack Brooks and a few volunteers could see the need to enhance salmon runs in the Sooke River and local creeks. With Jack's persistence, the enhancement grew from clearing log jams, salvaging and relocating fry, to clearing a small site on private property, where a few homemade gravel incubation boxes and old bathtubs were used to hatch and catch new fry. In 1981 the Hatchery was officially founded on Rocky Creek, near DeMamiel Creek and Youngs Lake.

Expanding from a few more incubation boxes to stacks of Heath trays, increasing the number of Capilano troughs, and adding large rearing tanks was made possible by the hard work of many volunteers. The Hatchery of today has grown to be the main influence on the ever increasing returns of Chinook and Coho to the Sooke River and its tributaries. Because the Jack Brooks Hatchery releases up to 700,000 Chinook and up to 200,000 Coho yearly, the proceeds from this Derby will help the Volunteers' endeavours to ensure salmon will return to our area for all of us to enjoy.

The Sooke Salmon Enhancement Society's members thank you for your continued support. We hatch 'em so you can catch 'em. Good luck!

SOOKE SALMON ENHANCEMENT SOCIETY 2014 Chinook Salmon Derby Rules & Regulations

- 1. All entrants **must** hold a valid 2014 Tidal Waters fishing licence or Status Card. DFO regulations shall take precedence in all cases. Your valid Licence and Derby Ticket must be shown at time of weigh-in. No Chinook entries under 15 pounds.
- 2. One rod per ticket. Extra persons may be in the boat to steer, assist in landing fish, etc., but they are not permitted to fish.
- 3. One entry fish per day (heaviest entry) per ticket. Heaviest fish will bump previous entry on the same ticket. **Example:** A 20-pound fish caught on Saturday would be bumped by a larger fish taken on Sunday by the same angler on the same ticket.
- 4. The same entry may not win multiple prizes. Prize category must be declared at weigh-in and cannot be changed. **Example:** Same fish cannot win the weight prize, ladies' prize, and largest hatchery fish.
- 5. Weigh-in times are as stated no exceptions. See Page 6.
- 6. Allow yourself time to drive to weigh-in station before deadline! See Page 6 for items to remember.
- 7. All prizes awarded at the Awards Dinner. Winners or proxies should be present to accept fish prizes and draw prizes. Winners not present will receive one phone call. <u>If winner does not claim prize within two (2) weeks</u>, prize shall remain the property of the Sooke Salmon Enhancement Society.
- 8. By purchasing a ticket, entrants agree that their photo may be taken and used for promotional purposes or forwarded to media organizations for possible publication. Parents or guardians of participants under the age of 18 must contact a director of the Society should they not want pictures of children taken or published.


Awards ceremony starts during dinner.

He was in the Navy during the second world war and after served in the Canadian Coast Guard. As well, he volunteered at Ayre Manor, the Food Bank and many other endeavours. JACK BROOKS HATCHERY

Last year's returning stocks for the Sooke River were about 1,500 Coho and about 500 Springs. DeMamiel Creek's Coho returns were down about 50% because of Fishery's removal of Bill James Dam, the lack of summer water flows showing up in the return of only about 2,500 Coho for 2013, compared to about 5,000 in the past three years when we had the summer water flows from Bill James Dam. SSES released 111,000 Coho, between Sooke River and DeMamiel Creek, of which 35,146 were clipped and released into Young's Lake. We released about 276,054 Springs into the Sooke River and 60,450 Springs from our sea pen project, for a total of 336,504 Springs released into the Sooke area.
